

Sheriff of Carroll County August 21<sup>st</sup> 1850

I know all men I Thomas Blanchard made this my last will and testament in the name of God our Saviour

1st I will after my decease my body be buried in a decent manner after the family order in a quiet and costly expence I will that all my just and lawful debts be paid out of my estate

2d I will that all my slaves be sold after usual time of advertisements which the law points out  
I will that all my perishable property be sold also  
I will that my beloved wife Lydia Dr Blanchard live on the Reserve when I now live during the time for which I reserved it with my family

3d I will that my beloved wife Lydia Dr Blanchard first have Five hundred Dollars more than her equal share with the children also the baby amount to Two thousand Dollars more than an equal share of my estate after my wife take her bequest

4th I will and bequeath after the above named specific legoys be deducted from the amount total of my estate then the remainder to be equally divided between my beloved wife and all my children

5th I will and appoint my beloved wife Lydia Dr Blanchard my Executrix James W. Buff & Willis No Roberts my executors to carry this my will into execution after my decease
