

Georgia, Warren County August 31st 1850

Know all men I Thomas Blanchard make this my last will and testament in the presence of witnesses
1st I will after my death my body be buried in a decent manner after the family order in plain not costly expeditious
2^d I will that all my just and lawful debts be paid out of my estate
3^d I will that all my Slaves be sold after usual time of advertisements which the law points out
4th I will that all my perishable property be sold also as aforesaid
5th I will that my beloved wife Elizabeth Blanchard live on the Place where I now live during the time for which I reserve it with my family
6th I will that my beloved wife Elizabeth Blanchard first have Five hundred Dollars more than her equal share with the Children also the baby unnamed to have one hundred Dollars more than an equal share of my estate after my wife take her bequest
7th I will and bequeath after the above named specific legacies be deductive from the amount total of my Estate then the remaining to be equally divided between my beloved wife and all my Children
8th I will and appoint my beloved wife Elizabeth Blanchard my Executors, James B. Huff & H. H. Roberts my executors to carry this my will in to execution after my death
