Georgia } In the name of God Amen.
 Wayne County } Life with me being uncertain I Thomas King of
 the said County & State deem it right that I should make
 disposition of the property with which I am possessed I
 therefore ordain declare & publish this my Last Will &
 Testament

I give And bequeath to my Son Josiah King all the property
 of which I may die possessed with the limitation or
 reservation of a Support for life for my wife Julia
 Anne King. Consisting of the East half of Lot No 203 in
 the 12th District originally unsevered from Harris County
 & State aforesaid being one hundred acres more or less
 Household & Kitchen furniture Hogs cattle & stock of
 all kinds & farming implements also food & provisions
 of all kinds with the aforesaid Condition & limitations
 In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal
 This June 29th 1868 his
