

Last Will and Testament of William B. Copeland Recorded.

State of Georgia I In the name of God, Amen.

Harris County I In the language of one of old "Not knowing the day of my death" I William B. Copeland, being in good health, and of sound mind and disposing memory, decent-right-proper & expedient to make a will disposing of the little property, with which my kind Heavenly Father Moste has endowed me hereby revoking and abrogating all other Wills or Testaments hitherto made by me.

Item 5 I desire my body buried in a manner wholly in accordance with the singular circumstances in life.

Item 6 I direct that all my just debts, if I leave any in peace with the last possible delay.

Item 7 I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Frances Anna Copeland all of my property both real and personal, to have and to hold the same for her sole & separate use & from the control of all persons whatsoever, during her natural life, and after her death, to be divided equally between and then alike between my children, Martha, Elizabeth, James, Mary, Rebecca and George; and his children Eliza, Jacobina, Lucy, John, James Griffin, Robert Griffin and William B. Copeland being eleven & three - In the event that either or any of them should die, without children living, then the share of the parent to go to the children December 17th 1863

Item 8 I appoint my affiancée wife the above Executor of this Will.
