

Last Will and Testament of Mr. Hopkins

I William Hopkins, during it right
and proper that I should make a
disposition of the property with which a kind providence
has blessed me do make this my last will and testament revoking
all others heretofore made by me.

- Item 1st
I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent and
Christian like manner suited to my circumstances in life.
- Item 2nd
I direct that all of my just debts be paid by my executor herein
by ten names.
- Item 3rd
I give and bequeath to my beloved son Pownell S. Hopkins
Eight Hundred Dollars to be retained by him out of my estate.
- Item 4th
I give and bequeath to my beloved son James C. Hopkins Five
Hundred and fifty dollars.
- Item 5th
I give and bequeath to my beloved Grand Son Wm D. Hopkins Son
of Pownell S. Hopkins Fifty dollars and my dead stead and bead and
Beading.
- Item 6th
I give and bequeath to my beloved Grand Son Wm S. Hopkins
Son of Wm D. Hopkins Esq^r. One hundred dollars and I
direct and desire my son Pownell S. Hopkins keep it in charge
until my Grand son Wm D. becomes of age and in case Wm D.
Should die before he arrives to the age of Twenty one years &
above the One hundred dollars be paid over to my Grand son William
S. Hopkins the son of Pownell S. Hopkins.
- Item 7th
I give and bequeath to my beloved daughter Lubenia Hattor Three
Hundred and fifty dollars.
- Item 8th
I give and bequeath to my beloved daughter Atlanta Cornett
Wife of Moses Cornett Five hundred dollars.
- Item 9th
I give and bequeath to my beloved daughter Valeria Chentine
Wife of Lewis Jenkins Five hundred dollars.
- Item 10th
I give and bequeath to my beloved Grand Children the heirs
of my daughter Parthena Hadley Esq^r. Namely, William
Hadley, Thomas P. Hadley & Emily Hadley Fifty dollar
a piece.
- Item 11th
Should my estate from any cause be so exhausted that of the
legacies, given above, cannot be paid in full then and in that
event, I direct that my son Pownell S. Hopkins and James
C. Hopkins mentioned in Item 3rd & 4th of this my will
be first paid in full those mentioned in the remainder there
to be paid in proportion, of what remains if any.
- Item 12th
I constitute and appoint my beloved son Pownell S. Hopkins
Executor of this my last will and testament this November 3^d 1873.
