

Last Will and Testament of William M. Haughton Esq. Recorded

State of Georgia / In the name of God Amen.

Harris County I William M. Haughton of said State and County of sound and disposing mind and memory, knowing that I must depart this life, deem it right and proper both as respects my family and myself, that I should make a disposition of the property with which so kind Providence has blessed me, I do therefore make this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking and annulling all others by me here before made

First I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent and Christian manner suitable to my circumstances and condition in life My soul I trust shall return to rest with God who gave it, as I hope for salvation through the merits of the blessed Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ

Secondly I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid without delay by my Executor and his executors named and appointed

Third I desire and direct that my estate shall remain in trust for the mutual support of my wife and children, until all my children shall become of age. To be controlled and managed by my wife Mary T. and friend Nathaniel Bridges; but should any of my children marry. My wife Mary and Nathaniel Bridges, if they see proper may have the privilege of retaining a portion of my estate to divide child or children that may marry to be returned at the final division of my property with the income thereof. Should my wife Mary marry again, then it is my wish and desire that my estate shall be divided immediately after said marriage - Equally between my wife and six children to wit; Mildred A. Seaborn H. Mary C. Martha C. William T. and John H. Haughton - my wife Mary receiving a child's part, and should my wife Mary have any other children by me begotten, then it is my will and desire they share alike with my wife and children above named.

Fourthly I desire and direct that should my wife Mary T. and Nathaniel Bridges deem it proper and prudent they may dispose or sell any property Real or Personal which they may think for the benefit and advantage of my estate at any time necessity may require and the proceeds of said sale applied to the purchase of other property for the benefit of my estate

Fifthly I hereby constitute and appoint my friend Nathaniel Bridges Executor and my wife Mary T. throughout in Executive of my last Will and Testament This 2nd day of April 1862
