

Last Will and Testament of William A. Hensley and Recompense

State of Georgia. In the name of God Amen
 Harris County, I, William A. Hensley, of said State and County, do hereby
 right and proper both as respects my family and myself that I hereby make
 a disposition of the property with which a kind Providence has blessed me, as
 therefore make this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all others
 heretofore made by me.

- 1 Item I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent and christian-like
 manner, suitable to my circumstances and condition in life. My soul I trust
 shall return to rest with God who gave it, as I hope for eternal salvation
 through the merits and atonement of the blessed Lord and Saviour Jesus
 Christ, whose religion I have professed, and I humbly trust have enjoyed.
- 2 Item I desire and direct, that all my just debts be paid without delay by my
 Executors hereinafter appointed, and I am willing my said debts should
 be discharged in their rights.
- 3 Item I give, bequeath, and deliver to my beloved Sisters, Ann E. Riddle, Carry
 V. Hensley, Emma G. Hensley and John D. Hensley, all my property, con-
 sisting of, six negroes to wit, Dennis & Susan, each about twenty six
 years of age, Nancy about twenty two years of age and her two children
 Ben about four years old, John about one year old, Arretha about
 sixteen years old, - Two Horses, One Buggy & Harness, One Yoke of Oxen
 and Wagon, One Mule, House hold and Kitchen furniture, Plantation uten-
 sils and fourteen Bales Cotton & one Gold Watch, to them and their chil-
 dren, free from the disposition of their present or future husbands to
 them forever.
- 4 Item I hereby constitute and appoint my beloved Father Ambrose Hensley
 Executor of this my last Will and Testament This December 9th 1862
 W. A. Hensley
