

The Last Will and Testament of William Parr, Recorder

State of Georgia:

In the Name of God Amen
Marinette County I, William Parr of the County of Harris and State
aforesame being of sound and disposing mind and memory of advanced
age and feeble bodily health and being desirous to settle my worldly affairs
while I have strength so to do, do make, declare and publish this my
last Will and Testament hereby revoking all wills by me at any time
herebefore made

First

I commit my soul to God who gave it, and desire and direct that my
body be buried in a decent and Christian-like manner, suitable to my
circumstances and condition in life.

Second,

I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid without delay by
my Executor herein after appointed.

Third

I give, bequeath and devise to my beloved wife Emily, all that Lot or tract
of Land, the place wherein I now live, for and during her natural life,
and at her death to be divided equally between my children, all except
my Daughter Sallie Crawford now the wife of Moses Crawford.

Fourth

I give and bequeath to my beloved wife for and during her natural life
all my personal property to assist her in providing for my children and at
her death to be sold or divided equally between my children, except my
Daughter Sallie Crawford now the wife of Moses Crawford.

Fifth

I give and bequeath to my Daughter Sallie, wife of Moses Crawford, Five dol-
lars in Cash which I desire and direct my Executor herein after appoin-
ted to pay over to her immediately after my decease, out of any money
or effects on hand after paying my funeral expenses.

Sixth

I hereby constitute and appoint my worthy friend Allen Richardson Execu-
tor of this my last Will and Testament - This 30th day of January, 1859.

Harris County Personally appears in open Court Allen Richardson, constituted
and appointed in a paper writing purporting to be the last Will and Testament of said
William Parr late of said County deceased as Executor of said deceased, and produc-
es said paper writing. And also personally comes John E. Gillespie one of the
subscribing witnesses to said paper writing, who being duly sworn deposes and
swears that he saw the said William Parr sign, seal, publish and declare the said
paper writing now presented in open Court as his last Will and Testament freely
voluntarily, of his own accord without any compulsion or undue influence
whatever; - that at the time of the execution of said Will said Testator was of
sound, disposing mind and memory - that he presents his said Will as a
writing in the presence of the Testator and at his request in the presence of each
other; and that he saw John E. Gillespie & Hessey C. Dawson the other witness, sign
said Will in the presence of the Testator and at his request -
