Last Will & Testament of William W. Kent and Recorde

State of Georgia } I William W. Kent of said State and County
 Harris' County do make this my last Will and Testament
 I give and bequeath unto my wife Matilda P. Kent and my son
 Charles Joseph Kent all the property I may die possessed of
 equally to be divided - My share or portion given in this Steamer
 my wife Matilda P. Kent is given to her during her natural
 life only, and at her death to go to, and belong to my son
 Charles Joseph, or his legal representative, if he be dead;
 But if my son Charles Joseph Kent should die before his
 mother and while a minor, and unmarried I furthermore
 will and direct that his share or portion of my Estate go to
 and belong to his mother Matilda P. Kent during her nat-
 ural life and at her death to go to, and belong to the natural
 legatees

Item 1^o I give and bequeath unto my wife Matilda P. Kent all of
 my household and kitchen furniture, my carriage, buggy and
 harness also two of my best mules and all of my wheat com
 and fodder.

Item 2^o I direct and will, that my Executors hereafter named conduct
 my business without any interference, for the best interest of
 my said wife and son so long as they deem it advisable
 and profitable to the best interest of my estate, and when
 they deem it advisable to close up my business (whether
 it be closed up in a short time or continued for a long
 time) that they do so at their discretion at private sale
 or otherwise without being forced under order or order
 of Court to sell the whole of my property at Public Sale.
 I will and direct that my wife only use the interest
 made on her share and in the event that she marries
 again I direct that a trustee be appointed to take
 charge of her share and pay over to her annually the
 interest aforesaid if she should require it.

Item 3^o I hereby appoint and constitute my Brother Thomas J.
 Kent my Testatorary Guardian for my son Charles Joseph
 Kent with a request and direction and authority to
 use a sufficient amount of his legacy in giving him
 an first class education.

Item 4^o I hereby constitute and appoint my Brothers Thomas J.
 Kent and Sidney A. Kent my Executors and my wife
 Matilda P. Kent executors of this my last Will and
 Testament.
