Smith & her children. Our share to my daughter Nancy Elizabeth Cunningham & her children. Our share to my daughter Sarah Smith & her children & our share to my daughter Nancy Elizabeth Cunningham & I appoint Constable, Auctioneer & Ordain Jas. S. Cunningham & Fleming B. Cunningham to be my legal, lawful executors to this my last will & testament, satisfied & confirming the same by their joint & several testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal.
