 do hereby declare, being of sound mind & memory, that
 I must shortly depart this life; and I do
 & I do hereby bequeath my family & my
 property, which which a kind Providence has
 allowed me, do therefore make this my last
 will & testament, hereby revoking all others
 before made by me. 1st Item, I desire & I
 that my body be buried in a decent & Christian
 like manner, suitable to my condition in
 my case I trust shall return to rest with
 who gave it, as I hope for eternal salvation, by
 the merits & atonements of the blessed Lord & Saviour
 Jesus Christ. 2nd Item, I do
 direct that all my debts be paid without delay
 by my executors herein after appointed, as I am
 my creditors should be delayed in their rights
 as there is no necessity for delay. 3rd Item
 I bequest & desire to my beloved nephew Geo. M.
 Carns whom I have helped to raise to the age
 fifteen years, one more given 1/4th Item, I do
 bequest & desire mine acres of land bounded by
 Craft & Tom Carns if not at my death
 then to be sold by my executors & pay all my debts
 any I owe & the balance of the purchase money
 & they be to belong to my executors. 4th Item
 I bequest & desire to my brother Samuel Carns
 parcel or tract of land on which he now
 stands five acres more or less, bounded
 east corner an branch above the spring
 line on the north side of the line
 the line between myself & James Carns
 the line near the road about 1/2
 along said road from

arrived & then sailed for dry hollow about south
 branch to the beginning of the corner to belong
 Samuel Cornus during his lifetime & at the
 death to belong to his two sons, viz. Thomas A. Cornus,
 Johny, Mr. Cornus & the balance of my whole
 estate both real & personal to belong to my beloved wife
 Betty Cornus, for & during her natural life or while
 unmarried, when married or at her death to belong to
 my two daughters to wit, Samuel Cornus & Richard Cornus,
 & after the death of Samuel & Richard Cornus to belong to
 the body heirs of said Samuel & Richard Cornus. And
 lastly I do constitute & appoint my two brothers to wit
 Samuel Cornus & Richard Cornus executors of this my
 last will & testament by me freely & made in
 testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand
 & affix my seal, this 17 day of March 1860.
