Upham Canthan five dollars, good & lawful money. 6th Item
I give & bequeath to my daughter Martha Jane for her soul &
separate use for & during her natural life, free & exempt
from the debts & liabilities of any husband she may hereafter
marry, the following property, to wit: Manda a girl about
seven yrs aed. one cow & rat her
decree to such child or children as she may have, but if my
daughter Martha Jane should die, leaving no children born in
legal wedlock, then I give & bequeath the above named property
to wit: Manda a girl about 7 yrs aed & bed & cow to my
daughter Rachel Livina Williams the wife of Dillard Williams
or her children from 7th Item. I give & bequeath to my daugh-
ter Frances Ann for her soul use for & during her natural life
free & exempt from the debts & liabilities of any husband
she may marry, or the liabilities of any contract she may
make in her own name, the following property, to wit:-
one negro boy, Jim about 9 yrs aed, a girl, Milly about
4 yrs of age & one bed & at her decree the above named
property to wit. Jim 9 yrs aed & Milly 4 yrs aed & one bed
