

Will of J H Brittain Deceased

Georgia By J H Brittain of said County and State
 Heard County being of sound mind, deem it proper
 to make at disposition of the property, with which
 a kind providence has blessed me with I therefore
 make the following as my last will and testament

Item 1st I desire that my just debts be paid should I owe
 anything at the time of my death.

Item 2nd I do hereby will and bequeath to my wife and
 three youngest children my home place consisting of
 residence and storhouse and two hundred acres of land
 more or less, and household and kitchen furniture in-
 cluding pianos, and a life policy of four thousand
 dollars in North Western Mutual Life Insurance Co
 for their use and benefit. If my wife should marry
 again to be divided equally between her and her three
 youngest girl children, share and share alike. On
 at her death to be equally divided between the three
 youngest girl children, should she children marry
 or as they arrive a majority she to pay to each one
 or all of them such amount as she may think
 best holding the full right to make them equal at
 her death or

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Item 3rd I hereby appoint my wife testamentary Guardian for
 my three youngest girl children without giving any
 bond whatever on making any returns to any Court
 of her acting and doing should she think best to
 change any investment or make any other she can
 do so without getting any order of Court, exercising
 sound discretion in the premises, if she should be
 be living at the time of my death, if not Guardian
 to be appointed by Ordinary

Item 4th I desire, the remainder of my property - both
 real and personal after the payments of my debts
 including burial expenses and putting monument
 over my grave to be divided equally between my
 six oldest children share and share alike.

Item 5th I desire that my executors sell any part or all of
 my property, either at public or private sale, just as
 they think best. They need not get any order of Court
 or make any return of their acting and doing
 only in final settlement of my estate with the heirs

Item 6th I do hereby appoint my sons Art. and W. H. Brittain
 my Executors and desire that they give bond for their
 faithful performance of duty my now W. H. Brittain
 owns one fourth interest in stock of merchantile
 at Antioch which is his and not to be charged

against him in the distribution of my estate.
