Item 3 I desire to invest my wife Eliza Pulliam with ample and full power to manage my estate for the purposes herein contained just as her own good judgment may dictate and in case she should deem it wise to change any investment already made or to make any other she has the right to do so should it become necessary for her to sell any portion of my estate she may do so without any order of Court either publicly or privately and without making any return or giving bond but to manage it just as though I were living.

Item 4 I do hereby appoint my beloved wife Eliza Pulliam my Executor. In witness whereof I the said Joseph D. Pulliam have hereunto set my hand and seal this May 19, 1899.
