 Article 1st. I desire that my just debts be paid I should I own anything at the time of my death including the placing of a suitable monument over my grave.
 Article 2nd I desire the remainder of my property sold and divided equally between my Brothers and Sisters and Mama or Mrs J.D. Pulliam share and share alike.
 Article 3rd I hereby name or appoint J.D. Pulliam my executor and desire that he after the payment of my debts and placing monument over my grave as directed in item 1st & 2nd, he then divide balance equally he need not get any order of Court I desire to invest him with full power to do just as though I were living without any orders from the Courts and with as little expense as possible
