

Will of Marshall J. Awtry, deceased

Georgia Heard County

I Marshall J. Awtry of said State and County being of sound and disposing mind and memory do make this my last will and testament

Item First - I give bequeath and devise to my wife Mary J. Awtry the following property to-wit: My entire household and kitchen furniture, sewing machine and clock one mule or horse; my buggy and harness forty seven (47) acres of land more or less lying in the North East corner of lot number (76) parcel six of the twelfth (12) District of originally Carroll but now said Heard County, the same being known as the Bewick Valley place. Also (\$400.00) four hundred dollars in currency; all of this free from all charges on limitation whatever to her own proper use benefit and school.

Item Second. - I give bequeath and devise to my daughter Mary J. McDowell formerly Mary J. Awtry the following property to-wit: The North East corner of lot of land number (114) one hundred and fourteen of the (12) District of originally Carroll but now said Heard County, the same being known as the same as here more or less to-wit: ^{Heard County Wills 1894-1900} www.georgiapioneers.com (50) fifty acres for life then to vest in & become the property of the child or children of the said Mary J. McDowell living at her death & if any such child or children be dead leaving a child or children then their such issue to take in place of such deceased child or children: but if said Mary J. McDowell should survive all of such child or children or issue of such child or children then at her death said property to vest absolutely in said James Awtry.

Item third. I give bequeath and devise to my son James Awtry One hundred (\$100.00) Dollars in currency.

Item fourth. The remainder of my estate I wish to pay my funeral and funeral expenses and if there be a surplus then the said surplus of my estate to be divided equally among my wife Mary J. Awtry, my daughter Mary J. McDowell and my son James Awtry this 1st day of March 1898
