

Will of H. Hood. Deceased.

George B In the name of God, Amen. I H. Hood of said County & of said State, being advanced in life, fast verging towards the termination of all things earthly and being yet blessed with sound & disposing mind and memory deem it right and proper that I should make disposition of my worldly affairs. do make ordain and publish this my last will and testament hereby revoking all wills by me heretofore made.

Item 1st I Commit my soul to God who gave it
Item 2nd I will & direct that all my just debts be paid with as little delay as possible.

Item 3rd I will, devise and bequeath one (1/4) fourth part of my real and personal property not otherwise disposed of to my daughter Mary A. Lancaster during her natural life after which to be divided equally with her children.

Item 4th I will devise and bequeath that (1/4) one fourth part of my real and personal property not otherwise disposed of to my son-in-law John S. Marden, & his wife my daughter G. A. Marden, during their life natural life after which to be divided among their children.

Item 5th I will devise and bequeath that (1/4) one fourth part of my real & personal property not otherwise disposed of to my daughter Mary H. Frederick's children after deducting all demands I have against said Mary H. Frederick and her husband Thomas H. Frederick from said one fourth part of said property.

Item 6th I will, devise and bequeath that (1/4) one fourth part of my real and personal property not otherwise disposed of to my daughter Elizabeth Coolidge's children and her grand children the issue of Barton Mozley.

Item 7th My real estate consist of the following tracts (1st) one hundred and thirty three acres of the original Muckle lot (202 1/2) two hundred two and one half acres of the lower Right lot all lying on the West side of big Clear Creek except a portion of the Muckle lot bounded as follows North by McCombs lot, and upper Right lot West by the lands of Taylor Thompson, South by the lands of W. H. Nelson and East by "Clear Creek also (202 1/2) two hundred two and one half acres known as the Bates lot also (50) fifty acres lying in the fork of little Clear Creek and big Clear Creek also (50) fifty acres of the Muckle lot lying on the East side of big Clear Creek.

Item 8th I will devise and do hereby appoint and ordain John S. Marden, H. S. Marden & Mary A. Lancaster my executors and administrators of this
