memory, but laboring under disease of
body and calling to mind the uncertainty
of life and the certainty of death do make
and declare this my last will and testament
herely revoking all other wills made by me
at any time heretofore - To wit -

Item 1st I Command my soul to God who I love it
and direct my body to be buried decently -

Item 2nd That whereas I did heretofore - to wit on
or about the 13th day of November 1861. make
and execute to my daughter Eliza Ann Lemon
and the children of Abel A. Lemon a
certain deed of gift to a certain tract or
parcel of land lying and being in the 14th
District of Monroe County and known as the
plan of said district as lot No. (89) Eighty nine
containing Two Hundred ~~Two~~ and one half
203 1/2 acres more or less - and whereas I did
subsequently to wit about the year of Our Lord
Eighteen hundred and Sixty Three make and
execute to my daughter Thien Mary Price (now
Jenkins) and her heirs a deed of gift to the
said same tract or parcel of land - It is my will
that said tract or parcel of Land shall at my death
become the property of my said daughter Eliza
Ann Lemon and the children of Abel A. Lemon
To wit, Elizabeth J. Lemon, Martha A. Lemon
and Abel Alexander Lemon share and share
alike to my said daughter Eliza and the three
said children of Abel A. Lemon Elizabeth
J. Martha A. and Abel Alexander. That my
Executor hereinafter named, shall in his
discretion see said land at any time after my
death, or, if he thinks best keep and rent out
or otherwise use said Land until all of the above

named legatus become of age, and that no part of said land shall belong to my Daughter Mary Jenkins or her heirs.

Item 3rd I give and bequeath to my affectionate wife Nancy W. Lemon, my Plantation lying on the Regd. Ferry Road, in said County and about two miles from Mt. Donough, also all my household & Kitchen furniture or as much thereof as she may desire =

Item 4th I give and bequeath to my Brother John Lemon and my Sister Elizabeth Wright all my interest in the lands which I and Abel A. Lemon now own in the County of Butts the same being the premises whereon my Father lately resided to be divided equally between them, and the one half interest thus received to Elizabeth Wright to be hers individually and free from the Control of her present or a future husband nor subject to his debts.

Item 5th I direct that my Executor hereinafter named shall as soon as convenient after my death proceed to sell all other property both real & personal of which I may die possessed and not already devised and after paying out of the proceeds of the sale of said property all my just debts, that whatever may remain be equally divided between my affectionate wife Nancy W. Lemon, and my daughter Eliza Ann Lemon and my daughter Mary Jenkins.

Item 6th I constitute, and appoint my brother Abel A. Lemon my Executor to carry into effect this my last will and testament, with power and authority to sell any and all of my property directed to be sold by the 5th Item of the will either privately or publicly as he may think best.
