Item 3<sup>d</sup> To my Daughter Penelope Basaw I give & bequeath five Negroes - viz Eddy a woman thirty one years of age & her four children William a boy twelve years old - Ann a girl seven years old Pleasant a boy four years old & Anthony a boy one year old, And the income of the aforesaid negroes now and ~~hereafter~~ -

Item 4<sup>th</sup> To my Daughter Susan W Johnson I give & bequeath (in addition to six hundred & fifty five dollars which I have bequeathed from time to time given her) the one half of my Money & the half of the Promissory Notes belonging to me which may be left in my possession at my death after deducting the Expenses of my burial &c.

Item 5<sup>th</sup> to the other half of my Money & Notes I give & bequeath to be equally divided among the Children of my Daughter Mary Calaway & the Children of my Son Pitt W Miller -

Item 6<sup>th</sup> To my granddaughter Mary E. Buckner & the heirs of her body I give & bequeath my Negro girl Harriett Martin just 16 yrs with the Christian branch that she the above named Granddaughter Mary E. Buckner shall pay over to her Sister Nancy M. Sims my Granddaughter the sum of Two hundred & fifty dollars in Cash And if my Granddaughter Mary E. Buckner should refuse to pay over to her Sister Nancy M. Sims the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars - it is my will that the aforesaid Negro girl Harriett shall be sold & the money she may bring be equally divided between them,

Item 7<sup>th</sup> To my granddaughter Susan A. Miller I give & bequeath one bed Bedstead - one pair of Sheets one Counterpane one Bed quilt & blankets - The aforesaid Bed & furniture I give in trust to my Granddaughter Mary E. Griffin to deliver to her sister Susan A. Miller when she arrives at lawful age or marries -

Item 8<sup>th</sup> To my three daughters Elyabeth Sims, Penelope Basaw & Susan W Johnson I give & bequeath all my bed Clothes (with the exception of one skirt already willed to my Granddaughter Susan A. Miller) And all my Leasing apparel & wish them to divide between themselves as they may think proper

Item 9<sup>th</sup> All the rest remainder & residue of my Estates of what Kind & nature soever not heretofore mentioned & will be equally divided ~~between~~ <sup>1884</sup> my four Children
