To my Sister Sarah Brown I give & Bequeath
my negs Girl Mary to be at her disposal
during her natural Life time and at her
decease the said negs Girl Mary is to belong
to my nephew Hugh Brown & his heirs
To my nephew Hugh Brown I give
& Bequeath all my wearing apparel
To my Nephews Robert Brown & James Brown
All Brown Hugh Brown & James Brown
Brown. I give & Bequeath all my goods
Vines & Cabbages to Equally divided between
them.

To my Nephew James Brown
I give & Bequeath all my Plantation
all tracts of Land containing one hundred
& Twenty Seven acres & a half lying in the
County of Henry with the Improvements
thereon.

As to my Lots & Improvements in the town
of McDonough I wish Rented for three
Years to the person who will with the surplus
of money after paying my Just debts with
the half of the said that I may draw in
the present Land Lottery. I allow my exec
utors to either sell or rent to the best advantage
in all cases to take two good Securities
& what ever money may arise from the Sale

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Maryann. Raiford & Sarah Moore the other heirs
of the Land. That I may save in the present
Land nothing I Give & Bequeath to the Anna
of The Gospel And for The discharge of this my
Last will & Testament I constitute & appoint
my well beloved, friend Robert Brown Esq of
Chapin County Ga my Attorney & Mr. A. White of
The County of Henry my Executors to Execute
the above in every part thereof according to the
True Intent & Meaning. In Witness I have here
unto set my Hand & Seal This 2nd day of May 1838

ie I allow all my last debts to be paid
out of the present crop or any other perishable
property that my well beloved wifey
Travis may think proper to dispose of first
I allow my well beloved wife wifey
Travis to have all my lands & all my
stock house hold and kitchen furniture
& horses & my negroy Ben & house to my
wife during her life or widowhood
if she survives me the property to be
sold and one half of the proceeds to be
given to my well beloved wifey Travis
the other half to be equally divided
