The last will and testament of
Arrington Phillips. Considering the uncertainty
of this mortal life and being of sound mind and
memory, blessed be Almighty God for the same,
do make and publish this my last will and testament
in the following manner & form. To wit

Item 1st I give and bequeath unto my beloved
Nether Lavinia Phillips a negro boy Carter her
lifetime to hold and to have his earnings until
her death, and at her death he is to be divided
in manner & form following. First I give and bequeath
unto my three brothers two thirds of his value, Elijah
Phillips, M. V. Phillips and Armistead Phillips to
be divided equally between them, Second, The other
remaining third is to be divided among Columbus A.
Phillips children.

Item 2nd I further give and bequeath unto my
Niece Mary Lavinia Phillips one tenth of
the value of my land lying in Henry County
Georgia I further give and bequeath unto my
Nephew Thomas Arrington ~~Phillips~~ one twentieth
of the value of my land, this niece and nephew
are to have those parts when they become of age
unless the Executor of my will sees proper to pay
them their portion sooner. I further give and bequeath
unto my three brothers Elijah, Phillips M. V.
Phillips and Armistead Phillips the remainder of
said land in Henry County Georgia to be
divided between them equally.

Item 3rd I further give and bequeath unto
my Youngest brother Armistead Phillips a
silver watch which I wish him to keep as
a token of me, and lastly as to all the rest
residue and remainder of my Personal estate
goods and chattels of what kind and
nature soever I give and bequeath the
same to my beloved Brother Elijah Phillips

whom I hereby appoint my Executor of my last will and Testament, hereby revoking all former wills made by me,

In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 26th day of October One thousand Eight hundred and Sixty three.
