County and State aforesaid knowing the certainty
of death and uncertainty of Life and for the better
disposing of my worldly goods do make and declare
the following instrument of writing my last will
and testament by is revoking all former wills or
wills whatsoever that is to say

Item 1st I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife
Elizabeth Kimbell the one half of my stock of cattle
Hogs and Sheep also the one one half of my farming
utensils and one safe used as a small Pantry

Item 2^d I give and bequeath unto my beloved Grand
Son Benjamin Franklin Kimbell one negro Boy named
Anwar

Item 3^d I give and bequeath unto Randolph
Kimbell Son of my beloved Son John Kimbell one
negro Girl named Parina often called Betty

Item 4th I give and bequeath unto my beloved Grand
Son George M Kimbell a negro man named Tom

Item 5th I give and bequeath unto my Son in law
Isaac Hand the sum of Five Dollars and also I give unto
James Moore also my Son in law the sum of Five Dollars
also unto William C Herrell also my Son in law the sum of
Five Dollars

Item 6th after paying my just debts I desire the residue
of my Property be and go unto Whitman H Kimbell my
Grand Son

Item 7th I wish and desire and appoint William
Kimbell my Executor to carry out my design and
desire about the disp of worldly goods as expressed in
this instrument which as I before stated I now say I do
Constitute and declare as my last will and testament
And by it revoke all former wills or wills

and affixed my seal this the sixth day of May in the
year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred and fifty one

 of each other and that H. G. Sullivan did so likewise
