by me at any time heretofore made and filed and
principally I commit my Soul into the hands
of my Creator who gave it: and as to such worldly
Estate wherewith I hath pleased God to bless me
I dispose of the same as followeth: I Wille &
In the first place It is my will that all my just
debts be paid -

2nd I give and bequeath unto my Son John A
Currier Negro boy being worth six hundred dollars
also two hundred and eighty seven dollars and
fifty cents in money which he has had in hand
and one horse bridle & saddle worth one hundred
and twenty five Dollars and one bed and two and
furniture worth fifteen Dollars which he has had
in hand also for which no interest or money is
to be claimed back from him -

3rd I give and bequeath unto my daughter Susan
S Currier one Negro woman by the name of Lily
aged about 30 years worth five hundred dollars
and one bed and furniture worth forty dollars and
Ten dollars in money out of the present crop
or the crop that is to be made this year as
most convenient the above Negro woman is
Susan S Curriers and her body dies -

4th I give and bequeath unto my daughter
Catherine E Currier and her body heirs one
Negro woman Mary and her child Georgia Ann
worth seven hundred dollars and one bed and
furniture worth forty dollars and Ten dollars
in money out of the crop - of Cotton on hand
or the present crop - to be made as is most convenient

5th I give and bequeath unto my daughter
Emily A Knight and her body heirs one
Negro woman Harriett worth six hundred

dollars one bed and furniture worth four by dollars
and ten dollars in money out of the present
Crop of Cotton or the Crop to be made as is
most convenient the bed she has need also one
trunk worth three dollars which she has need also
5th, I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Susan
Turner and her body heirs one negro girl Lucy
worth three hundred dollars one bed and furniture
worth forty dollars and ten dollars in money out
of the present Crop of Cotton or the Crop to be made
this year as is most convenient also she is to
have a fine bed and six or seven dollars to buy
one with.

7th I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Eliza Patisso,
one negro girl worth three hundred and fifty
dollars which she has need I give and bequeath unto
my daughter Eliza Patisso and her body heirs one
negro girl Martha worth two hundred and fifty
dollars, also one bed & furniture worth fifteen dollars
and saddle worth ten dollars which she has need

8th I give and bequeath unto my Son Johnson C
Turner one negro boy Charles worth four hundred
and fifty dollars also fifty acres of land or one
fourth part of Lot No 33, thirty three in the north
west corner of of said lot worth one hundred and
fifty dollars and fifty three years old this spring boy
worth sixty five dollars one saddle worth ten dollars

9th I give and bequeath unto my beloved Wife
Rebecca Turner during his lifetime all my Lands
except Lot No. 33. and all my household and kitchen
furniture except such as are given off in the
above will also all my stock of horses except one that
given off and one bay horse I must sold also all
my stock of Cattle hogs and cats & dogs also it is
to remain in our common stock for the use of
the family also the following negroes Louis Jack a
man and Fanny a woman Anderson Shells a child
and at the death of my beloved wife the lands is to
go to my son Benjamin Turner also Fanny & child
and her increase also Anderson and if my son Turner
marry and leave Anderson he is to have his

and at the death of my beloved wife I left
a negro man and all my personal property
is to be sold to make each one of my children
equal to him, Lucinda Turner, Catherine E
Turner Emily R. Turner - Susan S. Turner
Olive P. Turner - Johnson Turner.

10th My Will and wish is for arrange a negro man is
to be sold twelve months after my death and the
proceed of said negr to go and be equally divided
between B. Turner and Sarah Johnson and my
two Grand children Henry & Madison Rufus & Madison
the said negr is to be sold here by my Executor
either private or otherwise as they may think proper

11th I give and bequeath unto my son James
I Turner one half of Lot of Land No. 33, there
the east half of said lot worth three hundred dollars
and also two hundred and fifty dollars in
money out of my Estate as soon as it
can be conveniently paid.

12th I give and bequeath unto my son George Turner
the proceed of the horse to be sold and my trunk
and Harney or the horse if he wishes it

13th I give and bequeath unto my grand son
William B. Turner the coat that may be found
by Benjamin's man if it lives

14th I do hereby further appoint and ordain
Henry C. Muritt and John W. Langford Executors of
this my Last Will and Testament and when either
of the children should leave or marry they are
to have their property given up to them
the said name in first line at top interlined before
signed In witness whereunto I set my hand
and seal - Done this 1st day of February 1848
