In the name of God Amen
I Charles Boyne of said county being in a low
state of health of body but of perfect mind
& memory, believing it was ordained for all men
to die and not knowing when I may be called hence
from this life recommending my soul to the
creator of the universe and respecting my worldly
estate which I may be deprived of at this time of my
life, I will and dispose of the same in the
following manner In the first place my will
is that my Executors hereinafter named collect all
that is due to me and payable my last debts as
soon as the same conveniently can after my death
and at the expiration of twelve months from
my death my will is that my son Thomas
L Boyne be paid an equal fifth part of
my whole estate both real and personal

to be paid over to his guardian hereafter named
if he is a minor at the time in money or property
he may be willing to receive at the appraised value
and the whole of the balance of my estate both
real & personal I will & bequeath to my loving wife
Mary Bayne and our three children Edward & Bayne
John C Bayne & Hendry N Bayne equally share and
share alike each to be kept together and my
wife to have the sole control thereof until she
may marry and if she does then her equal share
aforesaid to be divided of to her and the balance
belonging to the three named children to be kept to-
gether by such guardian as they may choose or be
appointed by said until coming of age when each
so becoming at lawful age is to have his share divided
and paid to him and my will is and I hereby nomi-
nate and appoint Edward Bayne of Alabama to be
guardian for his nephew my ^{son} Thomas L Bayne
during his minority and whilst my beloved wife
Mary Bayne remains a widow she is to have the
discretion of selling property and purchasing other
property as she may think proper and I hereby no-
minate and appoint my beloved wife Mary Bayne
sole Executrix of this my last will and testament
hereby revoking all other wills heretofore made
This 15th April 1840

In the name of God Amen Robert Rowan son of said county being of disposing mind and memory but weak and infirm in body and calling to mind that it is appointed for all men to die do make this my last will and testament in manner and form following to wit
First I reserve my soul to god who gave it and my body to the Earth from whence it came to be buried in a christian like manner by my Executor
Second As for such worldly goods as it has pleased god to bless me with I do dispose of in the following manner and wish in the first place that all my Just Debts be paid the Remainder I give to my beloved Wife one half of lot of Land No 14 in the original Sixth District of said county where I now live one negro Girl named Fannan the all notes of hand and Book & c^t all the criers stock of all kind and plantation tools house hold and Kitchen furniture which she is to have use and control of during her natural life and after her Death the nego Girl Fannan is to go to the heirs of my son George Rowan body and the remainder is to be equally divided between the heirs of her body —
