Edward Oxford's Will

Know all men by these presents that I Edward
Oxford of the state of Georgia and Henry County being
advanced in years and infirm but in perfect mind
and memory calling to mind the certainty of death
and the uncertainty of life have thought proper
this Twenty Eight day of February in the year of our
Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty three
to make and publish this my last will and testament
revoking all others heretofore made by me.

1st I wish all my just debts paid.

2nd I Give to my Daughter Sarah Pickett one hundred
Dollars to be paid to her by my Executors out of the
money arising from the sale of my parishable
property.

3rd I give to my Daughter Polly Pickett one
hundred Dollars to be paid to her by my Executors
out of the money arising from the sale of my
parishable property.

4th I Give to my son Tolman D. Oxford an equal
of one square of Land namely my former estate
in Jones County adjoining John W. Jackson, J. S.
Mullins and others also one negro boy by the name
of Little John.

5th I Give to my son Edward R. Buford on half
of the lot of land adjoining my present residence
in Montgomery, and to his S. Bridger, also on a negro boy
by the name of John I solemnly called big John.

6th I Give to my daughter Elizabeth Bridges our negro
boy by the name of Nelson.

7th I Give to my daughter thereby M. Structure our negro
girl by the name of Fanny for her own use during her
life time, and at her death the said negro and
her increase to go to the heirs of her body.

8th I Give to my daughter Charity M. Johnson two
negroes Namely Jude a negro woman and George a
negro boy for her own use during her life time
and at her death the said negroes and their increa-
se to the heirs of her body.

9th I Give to my daughter Martha M. McClendon our
negro girl by the name of Caroline for her own use
during her life time, and at her death the said negro
and her increase to go to the heirs of her body.

10th I Give to my daughter Eliza Ann Buford the other
half of the lot of land described in the Deed
of my son Edward R. Buford also three negroes
Namely Mattie Pidge another also described and
furniture and other household and her clothing.

11th I will that my old negro woman be may be free
at my death and to live with any of my children that
she may wish to be under the care of.

12th I will that all my property that is not particularly
mentioned in the foregoing distribution namely the one half
of the lot of land my former residence in said county to go
with any negro boys and household and kitchen
furniture and the plantation utensils and also a negro
man by the name of Ned be sold to the highest bidder and
the money arising from such sale to be equally divided

As before and any other Oughton namely Elizabeth's
Prizes beately M. Johnson and Edge her executor.

It is hereby appointed my two sons Thomas and Edward and
Edward to Oxford my lawful Executors to this my last will
and testament.
