 Henry County that I Elisha Vincent of the state
 and county aforesaid for and in consideration
 of the love and affection I have to my beloved
 wife Sundry Vincent do by these presents give
 and bequeath unto my beloved wife Sundry
 Vincent during her natural lifetime the
 following property to wit an Black
 horse about Eight ^{or nine} years old an horse cart
 & Gun two feather beds and furniture six
 head of cattle two milch cows three young
 heifers & an calf an Toller and a half
 dozen chickens and the usual cooking utensils
 also five shoats two cubbords and an
 chest together with all the cubbord ware
 an shot gun and barrel also fifty acres
 of Land being part of lot Number two hundred
 and forty Two in the first district of said
 county being situated in the north East corner
 of said lot For her the said Sundry Vincent
 have and to hold during her lifetime as afore
 said and at her death it is my will that the
 above property and land be bequeathed and
 it is hereby then transferred and given to Lemmy
 Portwood which is a helpless female child
 whose mother is dead and which the said
 Elisha and my wife Sundry has had the
 raising of said child from its infant childhood
 for her the said Lemmy Portwood to have hold
 and enjoy forever in fee simple But if in
 case the said Lemmy Portwood should depart
 this life without issue then and in that case
 the whole of the above property land and
 other articles is to become the property of
 Elisha Overton son of Philip Overton and
 my daughter then and in
 that case the said Elisha Overton is to have
 and to hold the aforesaid property & land for
 ever in fee simple

 Vincent hath hereunto set my hand

of February Eighteen hundred and twenty
