

Know all men by these presents that
Henry County, Georgia, we, James G. Cook, Robert Cook
and William Hardin, Secretaries and
held and firmly bound unto the Honourable Judge
of the Court of Ordinary for said County and
their Successors in office, in the sum and full sum
of one thousand dollars for the payment of which
to the said Court of Judges and their Successors
in office, We bind our selves our heirs, Executors and
Administrators, in the whole and for the whole law
Jointly, and severally, and firmly by these presents,
Sealed with our seals, and dated this 11th day of
July 1825.

The Condition of the above obligation
is such that if the above bound James G. Cook
Administrator of the goods, chattels, and credits of
Elizabeth Cook late of said County deceased, which
have or shall come into the hands, possession or knowledge
of the said Administrator, or the hands or possession of any
person or persons for him and the same, do make an exhibit
unto the said Court of ordinary when he shall be thereunto
required; and such goods, chattels and credits do well
and truly administer according to Law, and do make
a just and true account of his actings and doings there
when he shall thereunto be required by the court: Shall deliver
and pay to such person or persons respectively, as they may be
entitled to the same by Law; And if it shall hereafter appear
that any last will and Testament was made by the said deceased
and the same be proven before the Court of ordinary and Executors
obtain a certificate of the probate thereof and he in such case
requested render and deliver up the said letters of Administration then
his obligation to be void else to remain in full force.

of the said or known judges of the said Court
of ordinary formerly Elizabeth Wallis or
of her heirs or person of any person or
persons for her & the same be made so
as to satisfy the said Court of ordinary
the sum of three thousand dollars
