 Item 1st

I desire that my executor hereafter named
 shall cause the remains of this mortal body to be
 buried in a decent and Christian-like condition
 trusting that the merciful Lord and Saviour
 who gave me life and being and whom I have
 for many years been trying to worship, fear
 love and obey will receive my soul into the
 mansions of glory to praise and adore ^{him} forever
 Item 2nd

It is my will and desire that all my just
 debts should be paid off immediately by my execu-
 tors.

Item 3rd

I will and bequeath unto my daughter
 Cynthia P. Waugh and her children a negro
 woman named Pop, being about fifty five years
 of age, also a negro woman named Mary
 about twenty one years old, and her four chil-
 dren, (ie) Levi a boy about five years old, Henry
 a boy about four, Peggy a girl about two years
 old, Zack a boy about seven months old, and
 Sally a woman about thirty nine years
 old by giving one half of her value to her
 Brother William Ray. Also the west half of my
 lot of lands No. eighty three in the third district
 of Henry County & State aforesaid one third part
 of all my stock of all kinds, one third part
 of the moiety due me in the crop made
 between me and Samuel B. Campbell, one third
 all my household and kitchen furniture of every
 kind whatever

I will and bequeath to my son William

Ray one negro woman named Harriet about
ninety years of age, and her increase one negro
girl named Lucinda about three years of age
and a certain negro woman already mentioned
about thirty nine years of age named Betty
by paying unto his sister Cynthia P Murch one
half of her value, as I design the said negro
woman shall be equally divided among them
also a certain promissory note for three hundred
dollars bearing date some time in the year eight
ten hundred and thirty five payable to me by
said William Ray my son, also one third part
of my stock together with one third part
of the moiety due me in the crop made between
me and Samuel P Campbell my son in law

Item 5th

I will and bequeath unto my daughter
Martha P Campbell one negro man named
Judge about ninety years of age one negro
woman named Julia about twenty years
of age a negro boy named Stephen about
six years of age also one negro man
named Jack about thirty five years of
age by paying unto my grandsons John Savinder
William Savinder and James Savinder one hun
dred dollars to each. Also the east half of my
lot of land No. Eighty Three in the Third Dis
trict of Henry County and State aforesaid
West half of my lot of land No eighty two in the
aforesaid County and State already recorded in
the of Clerk of the Superior Court in Henry
County aforesaid also one third part of my
stock household and kitchen furniture of
of all kinds whatever and at the same time
hereby charging my executors to pay
over to my three grand daughters (i) Sarah
Ann Thrabery and Mary Ray daughters
of William Ray one third of my household
furniture as soon as either of them shall
marry and become housekeepers for themselves
equally distributing it share and share alike
to each of them

I do nominate and appoint Samuel
P Campbell and William Ray my legal executors
charging them to carry the same into execution
according law and the meaning and intent thereof
