the merits of the atonement of the Blessed Lord and Savior
Jesus Christ, whose religion I have professed and as I
humbly trust have engaged for several years past.

Item 2nd

I desire & direct that all my just debts be paid
without delay by my Executors as herein after appointed, as I
am unwilling my creditors should be delayed in their right
especially as there is no cause for delay.

Item 3rd

I give and bequeath and devise to my beloved wife,
Mary Ann Crumby which with whom I have lived in the strict-
est quiet for fourteen years, One hundred and one fourth
Acres of Land being the west half of Lot number two hundred
and forty two in the seventh District of the State and County
afore said. Also four acres off of the South East corner of
Lot number two hundred and forty three in said State and
County, lying full on the South end of said Lot, and near
the line each due north. Also one hundred one acre and a
fourth in the second District of said State and County it being
the East half of Lot number two hundred and fifty four.

Also thirty Acres more or less in the North West corner of
Lot number two hundred and fifty five in the second District
of said State and County with all the rights, members &
appurtenances therunto belonging or in any wise appertain-
ing, to have, use, and control for her, and her heirs of her
body her lifetime or during her widowhood as a lifetime Estate
free from the use and control of any other person or
persons whatsoever, and at either of the above exceptions
all of said Lands will wholly go and revert to my heirs
to wit: John J. Crumby, Henry A. Marian Thomas &

My Sons Sarah Ann & Martha C all of which were born legally in wedlock, which all of said named heirs are to share equally in all of my Estate both real and personal after my wife's death.

4th I sell the rest of my Estate except the above mentioned Lands, plus all other property both real and personal that I may hereafter acquire devise to be sold to the highest bidder and the money applied to the payment of my debts until all is paid, the remainder to be put to interest by legal Guardians appointed by the Court for that purpose whenever my Executors shall have made such sale, & paid all my debts.

5th And I appoint my beloved wife Mary Ann, my Executrix and my worthy friends Green M. Phillips and George W. Castelow my Executors to carry out this my last Will & Testament.
