and memory and knowing that according to the common
course of Nature I must shortly depart from this world
deem it right and proper both as respects myself and
family that I should make a disposition of the property
with which a kind Providence has blessed me
I therefore make this my last will and testament
hereby resolving and annulling all others heretofore made
by me

Item 1st I will that is to say First after all my law
ful debts are paid and discharged the residue of my
Estate both Real and Personal I give and bequeath to my
beloved wife Catharine Gallman during her natural life
for the purpose of maintaining and supporting my
minor children and at her death I advise that the
balance of property that may be left at her death
be divided equally among my several children
I deem this disposition of my estate to be equitable
and just as my other children have been raised
out of the property belonging to my estate and I deem
it right and proper that the younger children should
be raised and educated before a division of my
property shall be made I hereby make constitute
and appoint my wife Catharine Gallman my executor
to carry into effect this my last will and testament
I witness whereof I have hereunto subscribed my
name and affixed my seal the 17th day of February in
the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred
and fifty three Henry Gallman Seal
