in possession of while a Widow.

Also the balance of my Estate, of ten my lawful debts is paid,
I give & bequeath to my children to be equally divided among
them.

And I hereby nominate, constitute and appoint my said true and
Executor Thomas Phillips of this my last will and Testament.

year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and sixty six.
