my last will and testament —
Item 1st I will and bequeath to my wife Harriet C. Turnipseed
the plantation upon which I now live with all the appurtenances
thereto consisting of one hundred acres of Land also one
mule and all the farming implements stock & all of my
Effects after paying my honest debts to hold and use as
her own during her natural life and after her death
to be equally divided between my two children
William Turnipseed and Ellen Givens —
I also appoint William Turnipseed as Executor to my

Henry County } I John Colvin of said State &
Country being Twenty Eight years
old & knowing that I must shortly depart this life
deem it Right & proper both as Regards my family &
myself that I should make a disposition of the
property with which a kind providence has blessed
me do therefore make this my last will & testament
holy Resolving all others heretofore made by me —
Item 1st I desire & direct that my body be buried in
a decent & Christian like manner suitable to my
condition & circumstances in life my soul I trust
shall return to rest with god who gave it as I hope

for eternal salvation through the merits & intercession
of the beloved Lord & Saviour Jesus Christ:

Item 1^o) I desire & direct that all my just debts be paid
without delay by my Executive Committee appointed
as I am unwilling my creditors should be delayed
in their rights especially as there is no necessity for
delay —

Item 2^o) I give & bequeath to my beloved wife
Elisabeth with whom I have lived for several years —

Item 3^o) I give & bequeath to my beloved wife for & during
her life or widowhood all my property both personal
& Real — after her death or after her marriage I
I desire that all my property both Real & personal
be sold to the highest bidder & the proceeds of which be
equally divided between my two children Nancy —
Margaret & Sarah A. Johnson —

Item 4^o) I desire further that as soon as possible after my
death that my Executive dispose of enough of my effects
to the best of advantage to pay all my just debts without
delay —

Item 5^o) I hereby constitute & appoint my wife Elisabeth
Executive of this my last will & Testament
