Elisabeth with whom I have lived for several years -

Item 4th) I give & bequeath to my beloved wife for & during
her life or widowhood all my property both personal
& Real - after her death or after her marriage I

I desire that all my property both Real & personal
be sold to the highest bidder & the proceeds of which be
equally divided between my two children Henry -
Maryellen & Sarah A. Johnson -

Item 5th) I desire further that as soon as possible after my
death that my Executor dispose of Enough of my Effects
to the best of advantage to pay all my just debts with
delay.

Item 6th) I hereby constitute & appoint my wife Elisabeth
Executor of this my last will & Testament
