Item Second, I desire that my Executors hereafter named
 may pay all my just debts

Item Third, I give and bequeath to my nine children
 five hundred dollars each either in money
 or property which I shall name below to John W.
 Daily I give the south half section ten Township twenty
 two of range twenty three in the district of lands
 subject to sale at Montgomery Alabama containing
 three hundred and twenty one acres. Also the east
 half of the south east quarter of section nine in Township
 twenty two of range twenty three in the district of
 lands subject to sale at Montgomery Alabama con-
 taining eighty acres, these two tracts I put to John W.
 Daily at five hundred dollars.

Item third, I give to Samuel C. Daily the north west
 quarter of section 10 in Township twenty two
 of range twenty three in the district of lands subject

to sale at Montgomery Alabama containing One hundred and sixty one acres. Also the west half of the South East quarter of Section Twenty one in Township Twenty two of range Twenty three of the district of Land subject to sale at Montgomery Alabama containing eighty acres. Also two eighty acre tracts of Land immediately below Sweto Mills on big Sandy Creek in Tallapoosa County Alabama These lands are considered worth nothing only for the mill shoal on them These 2 tracts of Land I found at Three hundred dollars and then Two hundred dollars in Money so as to make Samuel A. Dailey's part up to Five hundred dollars To: Rachel Dailey I give out of my estate Five hundred dollars also my Gold Watch, I give to Margaret M. Dailey out of my Estate five hundred dollars, I give to Mary Dailey out of my Estate five hundred dollars, I give to Amanda Dailey of my Estate five hundred dollars I give to William S. Dailey out of my Estate five hundred dollars, I give to David C. Dailey out of my Estate five hundred dollars, I give to Andrew S. Dailey out of my Estate five hundred dollars. The above named legacy to be paid to my children as they become 21 years old The Land on which I now live being part of Lot 11 Ninety-four and Ninety-five in the Seventh district of Henry County containing three hundred and about fifty acres. Also the following negroes to wit Peter a man, ^{and} Buck a boy ^{and} Anna a woman ^{and} Lincy a woman ^{and} Lincy a girl ^{and} William a boy ^{and} Blanch a girl. Those above named negroes and Land I wish kept together to raise and school my children including all my house hold ^{and} Kitchen furniture, and all of the Stock of every kind ^{and} the present growing crop of every description and my wife Mary S. Dailey and my son John W. Dailey is to hold the above named property for the especial benefit of my wife and children, if my Executors hereafter named shall at any time think best to sell any of the above named property they can do so at any time ^{and} place they may think proper Also they can have the privilege of clearing any land they may think proper ^{and} the balance of my Estate such as the Mc Donough factory on Walnut Creek and about twenty acres of land which has been usually

attached to it to be sold the first Tuesday in November next at Mc Donough on one or 2 years credit provided it brings 100 hundred dollars if it fails to bring the above named price they can try it again from time to time either at public or private sale for one year and a half, and then if it don't sell they can take up at the death of my wife Mary S. Daily the whole of my Estate which should be left to be sold and equally divided amongst all of my 9 children those who have not received their 5 hundred dollars is to receive it before a division is made if my wife Mary S. Daily should marry she is to have 5 hundred dollars out of my Estate and then my Executor John W. Daily is to manage my estate as he thinks best I do hereby appoint my son John W. Daily my Executor and my wife Mary S. Daily my Executrix of this my Will & Testament. I do hereby appoint John Robert Selfridge Trustee for Willey S. Selfridge to hold all the property which I now hold as here including land and negroes Notes, house hold and Kitchen furniture and every thing else which I may hold of here to be held for her especial benefit and use my wife Mary S. Daily and my son John W. Daily is to buy clothing and necessaries for my family as they may need from year to year out of what may be made on the plantation.

S. These 2 last mentioned 80 tracts of land joining Swells Mills in Tallapoosa County Alabama I give Samuel C. Daily was merely put in to wind up my lands in Alabama they are considered worthless only for the Mill Shoals. This was explained before the Will was signed.

Daily have received said One thousand dollars and appropriated the same in their business, and since I made said Will, I have sold the lands in Alabama given to John W. and Samuel C. Daily in said Will for Eight hundred and eighty dollars in the two Notes of John S. Smith John Roberts and H. M. Pearson except the west half of the S. E. quarter of Section 21 in Township 22 of Range 20 in the District of Lands subject to sale at Montgomery Alabama containing Eighty 25 1/100 acres.

Now as said sale of said Land revokes its gift in my Will, and the advance of the One thousand to my sons John W. and Samuel C. Daily this interest in my estate, my Will now is that the said two Notes of Smith, Roberts and Pearson shall first pay of my debt to Mrs Nancy P. Bennett for said One thousand dollars and interest, and after that is done it is my Will that John W. and Samuel C. Daily have the balance

Henry County In the name of God Amen, I David George, sen. of said State and County, being of advanced age, but of sound disposing mind and memory, thinking that I must shortly depart this life, deem it right and proper, both as respects my family and myself, that I should make a disposition of the property with which a kind Providence has blessed me, I do therefore, make this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking and annulling all others, by me heretofore made.

First. I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent and christian-like manner, suitable to my circumstances and condition in life. My Soul, I trust, shall return to rest with God who gave it, as I hope for salvation through the merits and atonement of the blessed Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ

Secondly - I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid without delay, by my Executors hereinafter named and appointed

Thirdly - I give and bequeath to my beloved wife, Sarah, for and during her natural life only, lots of Land number two hundred and twenty two (222) and one hundred and ninety five (195) in the Eleventh District of Henry County, containing two hundred two and a half acres each, with all the rights, members and appurtenances to said two lots of Land in anywise belonging. I also give and bequeath to my beloved wife the entire stock of provisions
