

Last will and Testament of John Whitsett

Georgia }
Henry County } Know all men by these presents
and Estate aforesaid being of a sound and disposing
mind do make this my last and Testament in
the name of God Amen -

1st Item { I wish all my negroes sold on a credit
of Twelve months except a negro by name Fanning
which I give and bequeath to my wife Sally Whit-
sell

2nd { I loan to my sister Sally Ponder the following
property to wit, one yoke of oxen one ore cart one
horse and mare four good sows and fifteen sheep
also four choice cows and calves and sixteen hund-
red pounds of pork with fifty barrels corn and
four stacks of fodder with two plows and two pair
of Plow gear this to possess and enjoy her life time
and then become a part of my Estate

3rd Item { I give to John Ponder my sister Sally Ponder
son a certified copy of all the household and kitch-
en furniture now in the possession of my sister
Sally Ponder she holding the use of the same during
her natural life

4th Item { My lands I wish sold in three equal annual
instalment with the entire remainder of my
perishable property not disposed of on a credit of
twelve months from the day of Sale the monies
arising from such sales together with all notes
and open accounts as may be due me together
with my money on hand to be equally divided
between my wife Sally Whitsett and my infant
child Louisa C Whitsett first paying all my
Just Debts

Turn over

1th 5th Item I should my wife ever many the negro woman Fanny above named to be sold and the proceeds to be divided between herself and my child Louisa L Whitsett I should my child die in infancy or without heirs my wife to become sole heir to my estate I should my wife die my widow my child shall become my sole and lawful heir to my estate

6th Item I appoint William Andrews and William Griffin my lawful executors both of the County and State aforesaid

All will made by me or existing purporting to be mine are hereby revoked and annulled
