 the debt due me and if there is not enough the balance
 to be paid by selling some part of my pro^perty
 that can be best spent by my family
 2nd I will to my dear beloved wife for negroes to not
 Dick Ruth Betsy Allie and Fanny to have her life time
 or widowhood and also two beds and all the furniture that
 belongs to the house and all stocks and farming utensils that
 is necessary to keep up the farm and three head of horses
 3rd After the death of my wife My will is that all my
 whereon I now live & my son Union have one hundred
 Dollars more than the rest. The balance to equally divided
 between all my children not with standing if my wife
 should think proper & does consent to sell it in her
 life time. My executors may do so & by her auth
 ority in place and be disposed of in like manner
 & after the death of my wife and all these in course
 must be sold - and all that they make while over
 her support while in life and all the balance of
 my estate and equally divided between all my
 children after my debts are paid all money left
 and all moneys arising from the farms to be
 Equally divided between my wife and all my chil
 dren except her necessaries requires more for her support
 when ever the same comes to hand I wish my son
 Joseph Hand & James Perkins to be my executors
 to this my last will & testament this 22nd of Sept 1834

one dollar to Mr. Bishop my son I give & bequeath one
dollar to my beloved wife Nancy Bishop I gave and gave
all my Papers & Instruments and bequeath to her all my
Stocks House hold & Kitchen furniture or property of all
kinds to have and to hold during her natural life
or widowhood & at her death to marriage to be equally
