named, as I am unwilling that my creditors
should be delayed their rights, especially as there is no
necessity for delay.

Item 3^d. I give and devise to my beloved wife
Sarah A. Roane, with whom I have lived in the
strictest quiet and love for a number of years, all
the Real and personal Estate I am possessed of, after
paying my just debts, with all the rights members
and appurtenances to said lands in any wise apper-
taining or belonging, during her widowhood. And
in the event she should marry, I desire and direct that
the real & personal estate she may have at the time
of her marriage, be sold at public sale, and the
proceeds of said sale to be equally divided be-
tween her and her children after paying said expenses.

Item 4th. I desire that my beloved wife, Sarah A. with
the advice of my father, Wm. S. Hearn to manage this
my last Will and Testament. This the 13th day of February
1871.

Richardson of said State and County, being of advanced age, and knowing I must shortly depart this life, desirous right and proper, both as respects my family and myself that I should make a disposition of the property with which a kind Providence has blessed me. I therefore make this my last will and testament hereby revoking all others.

1st Item. I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent and Christian like manner, suitable to my circumstances and condition, in life. My soul, I trust, shall return to rest with God who gave it, and I hope for eternal salvation through the merits and atonement of the blessed Lord & savior, Jesus Christ.

2nd Item I desire and direct that all of my just debt be paid without delay by my executor appointed, and I am unwilling that my creditors should be delayed in their rights, especially as there is no necessity for delay.

3rd Item I give, devise, and bequeath to my beloved wife Martha M. Richardson, with whom I have lived in the strictest quiet for four years, half of lot of land Number, in second District, Henry County, containing one hundred one and one quarter acres, about forty of which are cleared, with all the rights, members, and appurtenances, to said half lot of land in anywise belonging - free from all charge or limitation whatever, to her proper use, benefit and behoof, during her natural life or widowhood, with full power to dispose of the same, at any time previous, or by will or deed at her death, as she may think proper. I also give and bequeath to my beloved wife, in the same unrestricted manner, used on and belonging to said plantation of every all my household and kitchen furniture belonging to and used on said plantation, and my buggy and mules, all without reserve and limitation - I also give all the cattle and hogs belonging to my estate without reserve or limitation, and also my two horse wagon harness, seventy five bushels of corn, and three stacks of fodder.

4th Item I give bequeath and devise to my son, James M. Richardson five dollars.

5th Item I give bequeath and devise to my daughter Elizabeth P. Pope
