Grand Son, Robert, Musley, him a negro boy -

3. I will and bequeath, to my Grand Son
James Musley, Daniel a negro boy & I will
and bequeath to my Grand Daughter, Nancy
Selfridge, Randy a negro Girl, and if either

of my three Grand Children above named
should die without a heir lawful begotten the
other two or one shall, have the property, above de-
scribed, and the property I have left to my three
grand children above described is to remain

in Thomas Harpers hands, until the Children
comes of age, and as they become of age, they
are to have their property, & I will and
bequeath, to my son in law Rhoderic Harper
his a Girl Liza, Betty, three sisters, & I will
and bequeath to my son John Selfridge
all my land estate to gether with three negroes
Isaac, Hannah & her increase, & George with all
my stock of every kind and all my household and
