Second) As for such worldly goods as it has pleased god to bless me with I do dispose of in the following manner and wish in the first place that all my Just debts is paid the Remainder I give to my beloved Wife one half of lot of Land No 14 in the original Sixth District of said county where I now live one negro Girl named Garrison the all notes of hand and Book A ect all the creditors stock of all kind and plantation tools household and kitchen furniture which she is to have use and control of during her natural life and after her Death the negro Girl Garrison is to go to the heirs of my son George Rowan body and the remainder is to be equally divided between the heirs of her body —
