Christian like manner at the discretion of
my executors And as touching my worldly
estate being sound in mind and memory
I leave for my executors Alexander Johnson
& Spencer Reynolds first I wish them to
pay all my ^{debts} and then to take notes &
by my beloved wife Elizabeth Reynolds
One hundred Acres of land for a home for
her and I also give and bequeath to her
One Negro Man named Matt and all
the household and kitchen furniture except
two beds and furniture and I give her one
porcel Mare and I wish her to have them
Cows and Calves and the skins of hogs &
the ballance of the cattle & cart & sters
I want sold for the benefit of the heirs
And I want my beloved wife to tend all
the children together & nurse & educate them
And I wish my executors see to it & assist in
it 2nd I give and bequeath to my son James
& Elizabeth Reynolds a Negro boy named Bertou
& one bed and furniture
3rd I give and bequeath to my daughter
Phileas Ann Reynolds a Negro girl
named Margaret also one bed & furniture
4th I give and bequeath to my son George
Reynolds a Negro woman named Rhoda
And her increase
5th I wish in for my beloved wife and my

Execution to buy all the negroes together & to
raise the children on the proceeds of their
labour till a division takes place of their
labour and for each child to receive their
part as they come of age

6th My desire is that if either of my children
should die before they come of age for the
other children to have its part equally divided
between them

7th My desire is that my part of my Mothers
estate should be equally divided between
my children above named

8th My desire is that if my beloved wife
should many and my executors discover that
they are not treated as children should be
for my executors to take the children and
provide them suitable homes this is my
last will and testament
