knowing that I shortly depart this life I deem it
right and proper to make as respects my family
and myself that I should make a disposition of
the property which the kind Providence has
blessed me, I do therefore make this my last will
and Testament hereby removing all others hereto-
fore made by me.

Item first, I desire and direct that my body be
buried in a decent and Christian-like manner suitable
to my circumstances & condition in life. My soul I
trust shall return to rest, with God who gave it
as I hope for eternal Salvation through the merits
and atonement of the blessed Lord & Savior Jesus
Christ, whose religion I have professed and as
I humbly trust I enjoyed for eleven years.

Item second, I desire & direct that all of my just
debts be paid without delay by my executor
hereafter appointed as I am unwilling my creditors
should be delayed in their rights, especially as
there is no necessity for delay.

Item third, I give bequeath & desire to my two sons
Henry J. Black and Straim A. Black, Forty five
acres of land it being part of Lot No forty two
in the South west corner of said Lot in the 12th
district of Henry County.

With all the rights, members and appurtenances to said tract or parcel of land in any wise belonging, free from all charges, or limitations, whatsoever to their own proper use, benefit and behoof forever with full power to dispose of the same at any time previous or by will or deed at their death as they may think proper. I also give and bequeath to my beloved Sons Henry J. Black, and Estlin Black in the same undivided manner the farming utensils used and belonging to said plantation of every description whatsoever, One Horse and eleven head of Hogs, with all the House hold and Kitchen furniture belonging to and used on said plantation.

Item fourth, I hereby constitute and appoint my beloved friend John E. Farmer, Executor of this my last will and Testament This April 21st 1854.
