= Item 1<sup>st</sup> I will and bequeath my body to the  
earth from whence it was taken and my spirit to  
God who gave it-

= Item 2<sup>nd</sup> That out of my effects all my just-  
debts be paid and my funeral expenses be deducted

= Item 3<sup>rd</sup> I will and bequeath my land as follows  
to wit- I will and bequeath to my son William D  
Fair the parcel or tract of land wherein he now  
lives containing one hundred acres (The East half  
of lot number 247 in the 1<sup>st</sup> Dist of Henry County)

I will and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth & Adair  
fifty acres of land in the south west corner of  
lot number 250 in the second dist of Henry County

said fifty acres to be so laid off as to commence the  
North line to commence where the Linhouse branch leave  
John Dicksons East line and run thence down the said  
stream on the south side of the Lin ~~Branch~~ until it-  
strikes the cross fence then take a south course along  
said fence as to inclose the land cleared by William  
D Adair and then to so run as to strike the 50 acres  
of land known as the Gardner land Also <sup>1/2</sup> 50 acres  
of land more or less known and distinguished as the  
East half of the North half of lot number 231 in the  
second Dist of Henry County- The above named lands  
I will and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth & Adair  
and her bodily heirs to have and to hold for her and  
their sole benefit-

I also will and bequeath to my daughter Mary & Fair  
fifty acres of land buncher not known but designated  
as the Johnathan Ellis fifty acres the same being the  
place that was deeded to me by Allen W Turner

Also fifty acres in the South East corner of lot 250  
in the second Dist Henry County the above named lands  
bequeathed to Mary & Fair and her bodily heirs for her  
and their sole use and benefit-

I will and bequeath to my wife Sarah Fair all of

Lot of land number 250 not otherwise disposed of  
Also I will and bequeath to my wife Sarah my negroes  
Ben and Eliza also all my money notes and accounts all  
my horses cattle hogs sheep &c all my plantation tools and  
all tools and implements of all kinds all my household and  
kitchen furniture to have and to hold for her use and  
benefit during her life time

I will and bequeath that at the death of my wife all of the  
above named property left to her by this will and testament  
be sold and the proceeds be equally divided between my  
three children viz to William J Fair one third to Elizabeth  
Adair and her heirs one third to Mary H Fair and her  
heirs one third

I will and bequeath to my wife all my present cotton corn  
fodder wheat oats &c

— Item 1<sup>st</sup> I will & bequeath my soul to God who gave it  
and my body to the dust from whence it came to be buried in  
a decent & Christian like manner

— Item 2<sup>nd</sup> I will that my Executor pay all my just  
debts as soon as can conveniently be done

— Item 3<sup>rd</sup> I will and bequeath to my beloved wife  
Mary Kimbell the following seven negroes to wit Bill a  
man about twenty two years old Agam a woman  
(Bills wife) about twenty two years old and their four children  
Elmira a girl about ten years old Still a boy about six  
years old Jerry a boy about four years old and Alice a girl  
about two years old and Lucinda a woman about forty  
years old together with their increase and two thousand <sup>dollars</sup> (\$2000)  
in money to be paid ~~out~~ of the proceeds of the sale of my  
property not otherwise disposed of to her and her heirs  
forever I also will to my said wife two horses or mules  
such as she may choose from my stock two cows & calves &  
two sows and pigs & one bed and furniture such as she  
may choose and enough provisions out of the crop which may  
be on hand at my death to do her and her family for  
twelve months and as much of the plough utensils as she  
may want & one of my buggies & harness which ever she  
may choose and one two horse wagon and gear
