and form as follows I will first that all my just Debt

horses hogs cattle sheep house hold and Kitchen furniture
Plantations Tools waggons &c &c to my beloved wife Martha
Yarbrough for her own use and benefit during her
Natural life at her Death to be equally divided between
my several children (viz) William Yarbrough Silas
Yarbrough Nancy Moseley Martha Baggett Emily Richard
and Lucinda Baggett and do nominate and appoint Silas
Moseley and William Yarbrough my Executors to see
this my will complied with signed and sealed this 8th
day of March 1840

Georgia Henry County Court of Ordinary adjourned Term 1840

ng mind and Memory so far as he knows or believes and
and that he did it freely without compulsion and that he
deponent signed this same as witness at his request and saw
