 in a decent Christian manner at the discretion of my
 wife Barbara and Miles G Dobbins - whom I choose
 and ordain as my lawful Executors not doubting but at
 the general Resurrection I shall receive the same again
 By the mighty power of almighty God and as touching such
 worldly Estate it hath pleased God to bless me with after
 all my just debts is paid I give devise and dispose
 of the same in the following manner and form (to wit)

First of all I give unto my beloved wife Barbara during her
 life time all my land where I now live adjoining the
 Town of McDonough containing Two hundred and forty
 acres more or less house hold and to her furniture
 Plantation tools stock of all kinds that she may want
 Negroes Warren a man Sam a woman his wife and
 Will & her child Errett and Sige a man with provision for the
 same and after her death it is will and desire it should be
 Equally divided among my three youngest children Erasmus
 John and Martha I also will to my son Erasmus Negro
 Jack and Henderson also to John Brister and Carter
 And to my daughter Martha I will Will a woman and
 her two daughters all the balance of my property
 to be sold that I have not willed away and the
 proceeds from the sale to be divided amongst my children
 in the following manner (to wit) Grace Ann Shepherd
 one fifth part provided she has living issue of her body
 also Mary Ann Glouer should have living issue of her
 body one fifth part the balance to be equally divided between
 Erasmus John & Martha my 3 youngest children in either
 case of I have hereunto set my hand and seal and the year
 of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & forty Eight
