I do also give and bequeath to my youngest son William I and Bed and furniture in order that the said Mary Ann and William I may be made equal with my other children hereinafter named. The residue of my personal property to be divided equally among my several children and Grand children as follows Thomas I Crawford the narrow Caroline Walker Mary Ann Crawford and William I Crawford and I further will and order that the several children

of John Cole and my deceased daughter Elizabeth
Cole be paid their said mothers full distributive share
I do also will and order that my grand son William
Crawford child of Thomas Hamilton and Drucella
Casper deceased be paid the sum of Eight hundred
dollars - but in case the said William Crawford should
die before he marries or arrives at the age of twenty
and the legacy of Eight hundred dollars to be divided
equally among my other children, the heirs of Eliza-
beth Cole receiving their mothers proportionate share
To John Cole my son-in-law I will and order that the
