Henry County } Accord - I. William Green of said

I must shortly depart this life declare it right & proper
both as respects myself & my family that I should
make a disposition of the property a kind Providence has
blessed me with. Make this my Last Will & Tes-
tament hereby revoking all others heretofore made by me

Item 1st I give bequest & devise to my beloved wife Sarah Green all the tract of Land wherein I now live with the exception of twenty three & one half acres in the South West Corner of said tract of Land together with all the rights & appurtenances thereto belonging & I further give to my wife all the stock of every kind & all the plantation tools belonging to said decedent together with all the household & kitchen furniture

Item 2^d I devise & direct that the above mentioned twenty three & one half acres to be sold & the money arising from the sale of the same together with all the debts due me when collected to be appropriated to the payment of all my just debts & if there should be any left after paying all my just debts I give the balance to my wife as aforesaid -

Item 3^d I hereby constitute & appoint my wife Sarah Green my Executrix & my two sons Timothy Green & James A. Green my Executors of this my Last Will & Testament this May 8th 1853

the property which the kind Providence has

Item Second, I desire & direct that all of my just
debts be paid without delay, by my executor
hereafter appointed as I am unwilling my creditors
should be delayed in their rights, especially as
there is no necessity for delay.

Item Third, I give bequeath & desire to my two Sons
Henry J. Black and Ebraim A. Black, Twenty five
acres of land it being part of Lot No forty two
in the South west Corner of said Lot in the 1st
district of Henry County
