Rachel Culpeper Will

By the name of God Amen, I Rachel Culpeper of the County of Houston and state of Georgia a widow do make and declare this my last will & testament in manner and form following: first I resign my soul into the hands of Almighty God hoping and believing in a remission of my sins by the merits and mediation of Jesus Christ, and my body I commit to the earth to be buried at the discretion of my Executor hereinafter named or my friends who reside near me. And my worldly estate I give and devise as follows, first I give and devise to my brother in law Joseph Hill of the County of Wilkinson and state aforesaid all my lands consisting of a part of two tracts of lots situate lying & being in the fourth district Wilkinson County & state aforesaid together with all the appurtenances therewith belonging to the said Joseph Hill his heirs & assigns forever, likewise the sum of twenty two dollars in cash.

Also I give and bequeath to my brother Eli Warren of this state and County of Twiggs my negro man Joshua - also to my brother Eli Warren of the said state town of Laurens I give & bequeath my negro woman Mirriah but inasmuch as the said Eli Warren & Eli Warren jointly to pay over the sum of three hundred and fifty dollars to be distributed among my other relations as follows one hundred to brother Peter Warren, one hundred to sister Sally Scarborough, seventy eight to cousin Eliza Culpeper Hill now living with me, and seventy two dollars to brother in law Joseph Hill as above stated, I also give and bequeath to my nephew Abraham Scarborough my pearl horse called Fred - Also I give & bequeath to brother Joseph Culpeper my bed, bedstead 2 pillows and a bolster - Also I give & bequeath a pair of Country jacs, one of White Cotton & one filled with black yarn of wool to each of my three sisters by Sally Scarborough, Polly Hill and Patsy Warren - Also I give & bequeath to brother Sampson Culpeper one hundred dollars to be raised by dispensing of so much of

my personal property as will procure that sum; and
the remainder of my personal property to be disposed of
according to the last will & testament of my dear deceased
husband. — And lastly I appoint and ordain Doctor
Eli Warren Executor of this my last will & testament.

this 16th day of August in the year of our Lord 1832
