 testament hereby Revoking and annulling all others
 heretofore made by me Item the first I devise

 stances and conviction my Soul I Trust shall Return
 to God with God who gave it as I hope for eternal
 Salvation through the blessed love and Saviour Je-
 sus Christ whose Religion I have professed and as
 I humbly trust enjoyed for thirty years -
 Item Second I devise and direct that all my
 just debts be paid without delay by my Execu-
 tors herein after named as I am unwilling my
 creditors should be delayed of their Rights which
 as there is no necessity for delay Item third
 I give and devise to my beloved wife Rachel
 with whom I have lived in peace and love for
 thirty five years Two beds and bed clothes and one
 bed stove and table two pots and two covers and
 the small Kessels such as she may want to use
 and a set of Knives and for her one set of plates and dishes
 and four chairs all without Reserve or limitation
 Item fourth I give and Bequeath to my beloved
 wife for and during her natural life my negro
 woman Peggy about thirty years of age and my
 child Hannah about six years of age
 Item fifth the Rest of my property Both
 Real and personal wherever and whatever
 it may be I devise and bequeath to my

Children Martha Snell the wife of William
 Snell Lucy Whisen the wife of Leatt Whisen
 Willis Gormany Nancy the wife of Jacob Lewis
 John B Gormany Mary Ann the wife of
 William Fletcher Item the sixth I constitute
 and appoint my son John B Gormany Exr.
 and William Fletcher Executors to this my last
 will and testament This September the 4th

This instrument made in
in the year of our Lord one thousand eight
hundred and forty nine. I Reuben Marsh
do bequeath to my lawful wife & Nancy
Marsh all the lands that belongs to me
& my negro man Jack & negro Girl Mary
& his increase if any is to be under his
control his life time for the purpose of
uplifting him in Raising the small children
that is under age all these I Reuben Marsh
do bequeath to my dear wife & Nancy Marsh
or his Wife & property his life time also
my Stock of Cattle my Stock of horses
my Stock of hogs & my Stock of Sheep
these & all other things that I possess I
do bequeath to my dear lawful wife & Nancy
Marsh until my youngest child be of
of age then for it to be Equally divided among
the heirs & my dear wife & Nancy Marsh all
with the Exception of the above named prop
erty that I give to him his life time my son
James Marsh & my son Littlebury Marsh
I do appoint as Guardians for their mother
& the young children until they be come
of age also I do appoint them to act
& transact business for their Mother in her
absence as well as in her presence as though
she was there her self.
