

Will of George Millen

I George in the Name of god
born County Irwin & George Millen
of the said State & County being
of advanced age and knowing that
I must shortly depart from this world
deem it right and proper that
I should make disposition of the
property with which a kind
providence has blessed me & there-
fore make this my last ^{will} and testament.

Item first I desire that body be buried
in a Christian like manner suitable to
my circumstances my soul I trust
shall return to rest with god
Who save it

Item Second I desire that all my debts
be should be paid by my
Executor hereinafter named as
soon as practicable

Item third I Give and devise to each
of my Children to wit McPherson B
Millen Wallace F. Millen George L
Millen & my daughter Mary Rogers
from the first money raised after
paying my funeral expences to each ten
dollars, the intire residue of my
property & Effects to be sold as
when raised to be invested in stock
or placed at interest untill my
Grand Child the loss of the

that first born of my daughter
Rogers shall have attained
age of ten years at which time the
whole fund he it more or less
shall be appropriated to the
Education of said Child
Should he die before he
attains said age then to be app-
ropriated in the same way and
after the same manner for the ben-
efit of his next male issue
except a provision in item fourth
& fifth

Item fourth & which to be buried
at a point designated by a post
near my ~~dwelling~~ ^{dwelling} & that my horse
or horses & Buggy be sold to cre-
ate a fund to erect a suitable
Marble token with this inscrip-
tion & nothing more

Item fifth that immediately on my death
my ^{intire} ~~key~~ and ~~effects~~ shall ~~be~~
be delivered over to B. B. Reborn
of Cammerville to hold the same
in his keeping and custody until
my Executor can be appointed
of demise ^{which} for which he

Item first I desire that ten feet
of Earth measured Superficially
Back ^{ways} from the center of my grave
constituting twenty feet diameter
of ground be reserved in
portion as ^{my} burial ground
at the sale of my property & that
and that the same be in no manner
or form sold conveyed
or deceded away by my Executor

Item Second I desire that to save
trouble & Expenses all notes medi-
cal accounts & other indebtedness
that may be due me & unpaid at the
time of my demise be advertised
for thirty days at one of the most
public places in the respective
counties where the debtor resided
at the time of contracting the debts
and then same be sold at public
out cry to the highest bidder
