 Amen County of Wilcox I John Tomlinson
 of said State and County being of advanced
 age and knowing that I must shortly depart this life
 deem it right and proper both as respects my
 family and my self that I make a disposition
 of the Property With Which a kind Providence has
 blessed me & therefore make this my last Will
 and Testament hereby revoking all others
 heretofore made by me

Item 1st I desire and direct that my body be
 buried in a decent respectable and Christian
 like manner Suitable to my Circumstances
 and Condition in life my soul I trust
 shall return to rest with the God Who
 gave it as I hop for eternal salvation
 through the merits and atonement of the
 blessed Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ
 Whom eternally I have professed and I
 humbly trust Enjoyed

Item 2^o I desire and direct that all my just debts
 be paid With out delay by my Executors
 here in after Appointed

Item 3^o I Give and bequeath unto my beloved
 Wife Ann Tomlinson Lots or Tracts Number
 Twenty seven (27) Containing 111 hundred
 and forty five acres (245) more or
 less being the North half of said
 Lot also three hundred and ninety
 acres (390) more or less of the said Lot

Number Twenty Nine (29) at being that portion
of said Lot No Deeded to my son William
Tombertin also both Number Thirty (30) Forty nine
(49) Seventy (70) and Seventy five (75) the
last mentioned four lots containing four
hundred and thirty acres more or less and all situated
lying and being in the first district of Irwin
County together with all and singular the
rights members issues profits and appurtenances
there unto in any wise belonging to him and
proper use benefit and behoof during his
life time and at his death to my son
Wright Tombertin Joseph Tombertin and
Thomas Tombertin as follows
I do hereby give and bequeath to my son Wright Tombertin and his
heirs for ever in fee the lot numbered twenty
(29) and forty nine (49) to my son Joseph
Tombertin and his heirs for ever in
fee simple and both Number Twenty

with the initials W.T.

 breeds of oxen also my of ^{or} Cattle Cows
 and horse Cows also all my Corns
 and fodder and grain of every description
 sort and kind and all my growing crops
 of every description whatsoever at the time
 of my death and all my stocks of hogs
 with out reserve or limitation to her own
 proper use and benefit forever

Item I give and bequeath unto my ^{beloved} wife
 Ann Tomberlin my five negroes to wit
 Willis a Man about forty five years old
 Fizzay a Woman about thirty six years
 old and ~~my~~ two Children Handy a
 boy about eighteen years old and
 Kizzy a girl about eight years old and
 Penny commonly called Penny a girl
 about eighteen years old with their
 increase from this time to the time she said
 Ann Tomberlin dies proper use and
 benefit during her life time and
 at her death it is my Will and desire
 that the above named five negroes
 shall revert to my three sons Thomas
 Wright and Joseph Tomberlin as follows
 Willis Fizzay and Handy together with
 their increase after my death to
 my son Thomas Tomberlin Penny commonly
 called Penny with her increase after
 my death to my son Wright
 Tomberlin and Kizzy with her
 increase after my death to my son

Joseph Tomberlin to them or their proper use
Benefit and behoof forever

years old and their increase from this

and behoof forever

Containing four hundred and sixty
acres or less to her or her proper
use benefit and behoof together

and appertinances thereto Belonging
or in any wise appertaining during her
life time and after death to the Children
of her body for ever in fee simple
also I give to my Daughter Nancy Luke
Wife asforesaid my two Negroes to wit
Caly a Woman about twenty five years
old and her increase from this time
together with her Child Wiley about
about five years old to her the

twenty one year old and her children from
this time and Dennis aboy about fifteen
year old to his own proper use
benefit and behoof for ever

Number forty seven 47C and forty eight
48 (^{this} or ^{there} ~~the~~ district of Iowa County

Containing four hundred and sixty
acres each more or less to her own proper
use and benefit together with all the
Rights Members and appurtenances there
unto belonging or in any wise appertaining
during her life time. At her death to
the Children of her body for ever
in fee simple I also gave my
daughter Ann a Stithen Wife as aforesaid
my negro Ruth a girl about fourteen
years old and her increase from this
time to her own proper use and benefit
and behoof during her life time

my Executor of this my last Will
